Sub:- Allotment of rice under Annapurna Scheme for the months from October, 2009 to March, 2010.

Sir,

I am directed to communicate the district wise break up of 631.37 M.T. of rice for each month of October, 2009 to March, 2010 as indicated in the statement for distribution to the beneficiaries under Annapurna Scheme. The validity period for lifting of food grains and deposit of cost for October, 2009 will be fifty (50) days from the date of issue of Government of India letter No.4-6/2009-BP-II, dated 23.09.2009. For the remaining months the validity period for deposit of cost and lifting of food grains will be same as per instruction issued in Government of India guidelines dated 18.07.2008.

The allotted rice may be lifted immediately from the FSD, F.C.I. as per the quantity mentioned below against their districts and ensure distribution to the beneficiaries @ 10 Kg. per card free of cost. The unutilized rice under Annapurna Scheme kept with them may be surrendered to Government for reallocation of the same to the district.

Out of allotment of 22.65 MT of rice under Annapurna Scheme for Kalahandi district 0.23 MT of rice is diverted to Rayagada district for distribution to the Annapurna beneficiaries of Kerpai, Gopinathpur, Odri and Malligaon G.Ps of Th. Rampur block. Similarly, out of 19.85 MT of rice under Annapurna Scheme for Jagatsinghpur district, 0.44 MT is diverted to Cuttack district for distribution to the Annapurna beneficiaries of Uttarkula, Manijanga, Babujang and Mohammadpur G.Ps of Nischintakoili block under Cuttack district.

Municipality / N.A.C. / Block / G.P. wise distribution of the allotted stock of rice may be made under intimation to the concerned M.Ps / M.L.As / Chairman Municipality / P.S.



3. Orissa : 199.57 tons of rice for the year 2008-09.

2. The validity period for lifting of the food grains and deposit of cost for October, 2009 will be 50 days from the date of issue of this letter. For the remaining months, the validity period for deposit of cost and lifting of foodgrains will be as per extant guidelines dated 18.7.2008.

3. The food grains allocated under Annapurna should be utilized only for the purpose for which the same have been allocated and not for any other purpose/scheme. The monitoring and implementation of the distribution of subsidized foodgrains under the programme will be the responsibility of the concerned State Governments. The foodgrains under the scheme must be distributed by the State Governments through Fair Price shops.

4. FCI will issue rice/wheat to the nominees of the State Government as per district-wise sub allocation to be made by the State Government on pre-payment of the cost of food grains at BPL rates from its nearest godowns/depots.




